

Typical Cub activities in 1932

(as recorded by the 1st Observatory Wolf Cub Pack)

Saturday afternoon outing 30/7/1932

The weather being cold, I came to the decision that a good stiff walk was necessary this afternoon, so I decided to take the Pack to the Chestnut trees below 1st Waterfall on Devil's Peak, being the same ravine.

At 3:00pm the cubs and I departed from the Scout hall, made our way to the Obs War Memorial on De Waal Drive. There we continued up the path through the big wooden gate and half way up Plum Pudding hill to Lover's Walk, here we turned to our left and continued in the direction of Wynberg. Along this path I showed the Pack the fresh tracks of a buck, dog and horse and got them interested in locating others.



While walking along this path I sent some of the cubs ahead to conceal themselves amongst the rocks, bushes and trees and the remainder of the Pack had to see if they could locate them.

At 4:00pm we arrived at the ravine with the Chestnut trees in their winter garb. Here I gave them a flag raiding game, which they thoroughly enjoyed, pushing shoving and pulling down the steep slope.

At 4:15pm we made our way back home. Arriving at Observatory at 5:15pm
