**ORGANISATION.**

Normally, a Patrol consists of eight boys, one of whom is the Patrol Leader, and one a Corporal.

A Troop consists of not less than two and not more than eight Patrols, under a Troop Leader.

A Division consists of not less than two and not more than eight Troops.

A Scoutmaster is the gentleman who is in command of a Troop or Division, and who acts as instructor.

In each district a Local Committee should be formed to promote and control the movement. It should consist of gentlemen interested in the work, and boys should not be members. All matters of local organisation and finance should be entirely in the hands of this Committee, who have also the power of appointing or suspending Scoutmasters. They should also award badges to Scouts in accordance with the tests specified in the Handbook.

To start a new Troop and get registered, the following information should be sent to the Secretary of the Council:—

- (a) The name of the proposed Troop.
- (b) The recruiting area of the same.
- (c) The names and addresses of gentlemen who are going to serve on the Local Committee, naming the President and Secretary of the same.
- (d) The name of the gentleman recommended as Scoutmaster, giving a brief statement as to his business or employment.
- (e) The number of boys who are ready to join as Scouts, and, if possible, an estimate as to how many are likely to join from the district.
- (f) A certificate from a Justice of the Peace, Field-cornet, Minister of Religion, or some other recognised authority that the gentleman recommended for Scoutmaster is a suitable person to be entrusted with the training of boys. (N.B.—Social position is not sought after. This certificate is only asked for to ensure that a Scoutmaster should be a man of good moral standing.)
- (g) A certificate that no boys will be allowed to join except those of "European descent." The movement does not extend to the coloured population.

The Secretary of the Council will, on application, be prepared to give information as to supply of equipment, and furnish names of local tradesmen who stock the various articles required.

All reports, inquiries, or complaints should be addressed to the Secretary of the Council.

Headquarters in London will not deal with any such correspondence from units in the Colony, except through the Scout Council for the Colony.
