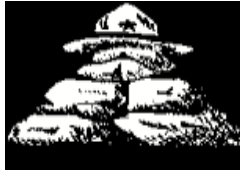


Mahikeng Scouting Heritage Camporee



Invitation

The Mafikeng District Scouts hereby take great pleasure in inviting all Scouting and Guiding members to join-in for a "Mahikeng Scouting Heritage Relief Camporee". The camp is aimed at reviving, developing and celebrating scouting within the District, through an adventurous and developmental programme which will definitely create awesome experiences and memories that will linger long.

What actually will be happening

The camp programme is to be categorized into five (5) aspects which are as follow:

- **Scouting exhibition**

Take part in the showcasing of fine & creative art and scouting skills through performances & exhibitions of activity programmes i.e. pioneering gadgets display, karaoke, graffiti and e.t.c in public parks, bridges, malls and complexes parking lots. **(International, National and districts Scouts/Guides are requested to prepare their exhibitions for the day)**

- **Infrastructural development project**

Contribute in the construction of the newly developed District campsite which in future will serve as a home for all Scouts and Guides visiting Mahikeng, or help out in the renovation, revamping and updating of the Scouts archive wall which form one of the most important highlighted sections of the Mahikeng museum.

(International, National and District Scouts/Guides are humbly requested to donate Scarves, badges, literature and/or any other materials/equipments relevant for Scouting/Guiding archiving and campsite development)

- **Community outreach programmes**

Play sports games with local communities, and contribute in “creating a better world” by helping out at community based medical, educational and social welfare institutions i.e. hospitals,clinics,home based cares, old aged homes and schools,**(international, National and district Scouts/Guides also welcomed to suggest their anticipated community outreach programmes)**

- **Agricultural and environmental awareness projects**

Be part of the Climate change, water sanitation and food security projects which also contribute to “creating a better world” to communities, by planting fruit trees and vegetable gardens **(International, National and district Scouts/Guides also welcomed to suggest their anticipated community outreach programmes)**

- **On- campsite activities**

Have fun, test your skills and ability to work as a team while strengthening friendships by participating in on site activities as;

- Competitions (e.g. cooking, knotting and e.t.c)
- Ultimate challenges and teambuilding activities.
- Games (e.g. handicapped awareness, survival, outdoors,indeginious)

❖ **Participation**

Participation is open to all scouts and guides aged between 16-35 years, and is exempted for only 300 scouts and guides from all local, national and international organizations and associations. In keeping with the policies of the South African Scout Association, requirements for participation in the camporee are without regard to gender, race, color, creed or national origin. Participants are highly expected to comply with the Policies, organization and rules of the South African Scout Association.

- **THE CAMPOREE IS TO BE HELD AS FOLLOW;**

- **DATE :** 20-27 September 2010
- **VENUE :** Mahikeng (Sports grounds and rugby fields)
- **Camporee fees :** as per list below

ALL APPLICATIONS FOR PARTICIPATION SHOULD BE FORWARDED BEFORE THE 21 AUGUST 2010.

- **Transport**

Transportation that will be available shall only be for the camporee programme activities (to and from projects and excursions only). Participants are requested to arrange their own transport to and from Mahikeng.

- **Camporee accommodations**

Sports fields will be used as base camps where tight security will be secured, as it is planned that the camp should be as visible as possible to the communities. Each participating scout/guide, patrol or contingent is required to bring their own camping equipments i.e. tents, eating utensils and e.t.c.

For those wishing to arrive 5(five) days earlier before the camporee or remain for that duration after the camporee, hospitality arrangements can be done but only in prior notification.
