

SEA SCOUT BASE COURSES General Information and Kit List

Signing up:

1. Log onto the Permits & Courses online system (<http://www.wcpermits.org.za>)
2. Apply for the course you want to do. Note: All Sea Scout Base Courses are online, but please check that you comply with the pre-requisites
3. Make the payment as per the automated reply
4. Do not fax the indemnity form; bring it with on the course.
5. Inform Julie Terblanche of any special dietary or medical requirements.

Times

All Courses start at 14:00 Saturday and end at 16:00 Sunday

You are required to stay overnight and attend both weekends where applicable, The course runs to a program of theoretical and practical training, which makes full attendance as important as passing the assessment at the end.

Format:

Arrive in Uniform for the parade that starts promptly at 14:00. You will be provided with three cooked meals starting with dinner on the Saturday. Meals are served in the hall and you do not need to bring any mess kits. Cool drink and biscuits are also served at tea times. A tuck shop usually runs once or twice in the weekend too. Accommodation is provided in the bunkhouses/dormitories. The Base has two ablution blocks with private hot showers – you are encouraged to wash during the weekend

What to Bring:

You will also receive a Seamanship manual if you have not been on a base course already.

If you have already been issued a manual – **DON'T FORGET TO BRING IT**

You will need to arrive in **full uniform** and bring the following:

Sleeping Bag

Pillow

Spare clothes and shoes (to get wet!)*

Water proofs (for rain and splash)

Pen / pencil / notepad

Toiletries

Seamanship manual **if you have one already**

**All the courses involve getting wet with the exception of Boatswain. Shoes, booties or strops must be worn at all times for your safety. Slip slops or any other shoe that can slip off in the water will not suffice. An easy solution is to bring an old pair of takkies that can get wet. Plenty of spare clothes are advised as you could get wet several times.*
